SIGNS OF AN ALLERGIC REACTION:

Systems

- MOUTH
- THROAT
- SKIN
- GUT
- LUNG
- HEART

Symptoms

- itching & swelling of the lips, tongue, or mouth
- itching and/or a sense of tightness in the throat, hoarseness and hacking cough
- hives, itchy rash, and/or swelling about the face or extremities
- nausea, abdominal cramps, vomiting, and/or diarrhea
- shortness of breath, repetitive coughing, and/or wheezing
- "thready" pulse, "passing-out"

The severity of symptoms can quickly change. All the above symptoms can potentially progress to a life-threatening situation.

Child Care Plan for Medical Conditions
